FROM THE PRINCIPAL



PARENT INFORMATION SESSION Last night we were fortunate to have Susan McLean, Australia's Leading Cyber Safety Expert, share with our community some information about Cyber Safety. This session delivered important messages about caring for kids in an online world. With the explosion of cyber technology, the issues of cyberbullying and 'sexting', are emerging as the number one issue confronting the safety and wellbeing of young people and the wider community. All too often, the digital world that is being accessed at home, is coming into school classrooms and the school yard.

Today, Susan met with the Grade 4, 5 and 6 students to educate them on how their choices can help keep them safe online. She encouraged anyone experiencing an online problem to **be brave and tell a trusted adult.** A key message she gave was that Australian children must be **13 years old** before signing up for a social media account. To be safe online, our children need to be **honest, responsible and follow the terms & conditions** of any platform they sign up for.
















YEAR 1/2




We invite all Year 4 girls to join us for a day of learning and fun activities to


