#### A Positive Approach to Supporting Student Behaviour

As we continue to settle into the new school year, classroom teachers are also continuing to build Consistent Predictable Routines into their daily classroom practice. A part of this routine and structure is about sending a consistent message when supporting student behaviours. We approach the management of student behaviours at St Paul's in a positive manner. Students are rewarded and praised for demonstrating the BE Rules in their daily school interactions.


#### Responding to Student Behaviours

At St Paul's we respond to student behaviours using a 'learning' approach. The **Behaviour Management** Flowchart is displayed in each classroom and teachers respond to students behaviours by following a sequence of steps. The students are also familiar with the process and how their teacher will respond to their behaviour.

ONLINE ORDERING Your child's school photos are now available for secure online purchase, please note if you are ordering online, you do not need to return an envelope to the school

Step 4: Pay for the photos via the shopping cart (upper right corner of the page)

\*\*Online Orders have a 1.5% merchant fee applied when using Visa, Mastercard or PayPal.

Please Note: If you miss photo day, portrait and group packages can still be ordered online for 7 days afterwards with no late fees. After that time, late orders will require separate processing and handling and therefore will incur a \$15 late fee per package.





# STEM IS BACK!!!


Grade 5/6 ML kicking off STEM for 2023, by learning about gears, pulleys, and axles!
