ONLINE SAFETY

Last week we had Cyber Safety Expert **Susan McLean** visit our school sharing valuable information with parents and students. Following on from that session, here are some of Susan's safety tips and what to do if your child is feeling unsafe online:

- Thank your child for coming to you this is a positive step forward
- Ask to see what has happened (keep screenshots or print out evidence
- Reassure your child that you will help them
- Help them block the person on their device and on the site
- Report the abuse to the site (report the account and/or the post)
- Enlist the help of the eSafety Commissioner <u>www.esafety.gav.au</u> if the social media site fails to remove the content
- Inform the school, sporting club, etc... and leave it in their hands
- Check in with your child to see that it has been resolved (act if it has not)

- It's a day celebrated around the world to mark the beginning of Lent.


















We met Peter the Penguin who introduced us to the letter sound /p/.

Here is what 3/4ST will be giving up and some acts of kindness we will try to do more of during this season of Lent.







Please recycle your bread tags at home if they are cardboard, or if plastic, we have a collection bin for them too in the senior corridor!


Our Goal: 4 Bins of Bread Bags by July 7!




We invite all Year 4 girls to join us for a day of learning and fun activities to

Pedestrian & Vehicle Traffic Counts

Dear Principal

I wish to advise that Council will be conducting pedestrian and vehicle counts in the vicinity of your school in the upcoming months.

The counts are being conducted by an external traffic survey company and will involve the use of video cameras to capture the data. I wish to advise that no persons can be identified in any video footage captured for this survey. All images are automatically blurred by the camera at the time of capture and all footage is automatically permanently deleted once the count is completed. Further to this, the count is undertaken by computer software, so no person will actually view the video footage.
