Please make every effort to ensure that your child is in the classroom by 8.50am each morning. Children who are not at school by 8.50am will be marked as absent.

**School ends at 3:30pm**. The end of the day routine in the classroom is just as important as the beginning of the day. It is important that children are at school until the end of the day to conclude learning and receive any important end of day messages. Please do not schedule regular after school activities within school hours. Children who leave before 3:30pm will be marked as absent.

#### **Medical Management**

This is a gentle reminder to all families that if your child has been diagnosed with a medical condition such as **Anaphylaxis**, **Asthma and/or an Allergy**, could you please provide all relevant details if you haven't already done so? Could I please kindly ask you to hand an updated plan to the Administration staff or myself. The relevant Action Plan (ASCIA and Asthma Australia) need to be handed in no later than **Friday 10 February**. Please remember that these plans need to be dated and signed by your GP.

Finally, a reminder that if your child is anaphylactic and requires an EpiPen and/or any medication, these also need to be handed in to Administration as soon as possible.

Students who do not have an up-to-date action plan and EpiPen will not be permitted to attend excursions and other offsite activities.

We are looking forward to a fun filled year of learning in 2023.


















# **YEAR 1/2**


