We celebrated Harmony Week and explored what harmony means to us. We loved the performance from Majeda Beatty on Thursday too!





















The people who score these tests don't know that some of you love to sing, are good at drawing, play soccer, football or can teach someone how to use a computer program.

They have not seen the way some of you dance with grace or speak confidently to a large group. They do not know that your friends count on you to be there for them when they are sad.

They do not know that you participate in sports, help your mum and dad, or that you play with your little brothers, sisters and cousins. They do not know that you are caring, thoughtful and that everyday, you do your best. Because these attributes cannot be tested.

The scores that you get from this test will tell you how you did on the day, but they will not tell you everything.

They can't tell you that you have improved on something that you once found difficult. They can't tell you that you brighten up your teacher's day. They can't tell you how amazingly special you are.


SUSTAINABILITY
