What does research tell us about this work:



Wellbeing - The importance of Connecting with your Child

When you make time to connect, your child learns that they are important, loved and cared for. This helps them to thrive emotionally and physically! Connection with your child also helps you to acknowledge and respond to your child's experiences and emotions while building understanding. Connection helps children to learn:

- Confidence in their abilities and self-esteem;
- To cope with problems, disappointments and challenges;
- They are supported with any problem they have and can workout a solution without conflict or blame;
- They are loved and valued for who they are;
- To stay positive and accept that everyone makes mistakes and that you can learn from them;
- Social skills around communication, sharing, being a good friend and connecting with others.

Questions for your children that initiate conversation

"If I said yes to anything right now, what would you ask me?"

This question helps you get into your child's world and see what their biggest wish is!

"If you could be any animal, what would you be and why?"

Playful questions help you get to know your child more intimately and help them stay engaged in the conversation! "If you could have any superpower, what would you have and why?"

This question uses playfulness to get on your child's level and learn more about their inner world!

"What was one kind thing you saw someone do today?"

This encourages kindness in your family and makes your child aware of ways they can be kind to others too!

"What's one new thing that you learned today?"

This helps your child develop a growth mindset and remember that we all learn and grow every day.

"What was one mistake that you made today?"

Normalize for your kids that we all make mistakes every day! Mistakes are how we learn and grow.

Please Remember - Sunday is Keep Australia Beautiful Day. How will you make our world a better place?























YEAR 3/4














SUSTAINABILITY

DID YOU KNOW


It takes:




We invite all Year 4 girls to join us for a day of learning and fun activities to
