

Designs will be judged based on 3 criteria:

Effectiveness of the Boat:

Points will be allocated based on demonstrations of the boat and will consider the:

- distance travelled
- carry weight
- speed achieved, and
- the environmental impact of materials and powersource used.

Physics Application in Design:

Points will be awarded for the creativity and complexity of the boat design, including how physics principles have been considered in the design.

Understanding of Physics Principles:

Students will be asked to verbally explain physics principles and forces that were considered in the design and construction of their boat.


We had a fun filled day which included some dancing, number tasks, 100 fruit loops necklace and a yummy pizza lunch.

As part of this well-being focus, we are introducing the children to a problem-solving procedure they could follow during play times.


Perhaps you could take a minute to go through the plans pictured below with the children and reinforce the procedures outlined


Please also remind your child that teachers are always around during recess and lunch times to make sure that children can problem solve and have fun as they play. After all, that's what playing is all about

In order to encourage reading & books to read for the Premiers' Reading Challenge, we are featuring book reviews as recommended by the wonderful readers at St Paul's!

This week, Isabella U (Year 3/4D) shares her book review of Winston and the Indoor Cat by Leila Rudge

Winston and the Indoor Cat is a story about two cats who live different lives, one is a stray and one is a pampered house cat. When they explore each other's worlds, they discover that maybe the grass isn't always greener on the other side. I loved this book because it has a good message about being true to yourself but that it's okay to step out of your comfort zone sometimes. The illustrations added a lot of detail to the story and made it really enjoyable to read.

I would rate this book 10 out of 10 because it is the kind of book that you can read many times without getting bored. I would recommend this book for preps to year 3s or for anybody who loves cats. Even though it's a picture book, older kids will still find it exciting as they wonder what will happen next to these two friends.
