Soft drink donations; Please support us by kindly donating 6 cans of any soft drink to sell on the day.





We wore a splash of yellow and made listening ears for R U OK? Day. We learnt about the importance of listening to people when they are talking to us, especially if they are sharing a problem.



NURTURING RESILIENCE IN OUR CHILDREN: Part two

FOOD FOR THOUGHT



Dear Families,

In a previous newsletter, the term "**resilience**" was introduced to describe how children can bounce back in order to deal with unhappy or challenging experiences they sometimes go through.

Here are more ideas about developing resilience in our children:

- Teach children problem solving skills. At times we are tempted to solve problems for our children that they may be capable of solving themselves.
- It is important to have high, but realistic, expectations of our children
- Failure and feeling bad are actually building blocks for success. When children make mistakes, talk to them about things they may have learnt from the experience.
- Work in partnership with teachers to help develop resilience in children
- When children discuss a conflict experience with another child, encourage them to explore the other child's perspective. Ask them to think about: "what else could it be?"

Think about:

Perhaps you could continue your discussion about resilience with your children and brainstorm things they can do when they are going through one of life's downs. How are your children resilient on these occasions?

Remember:

Come up with a series of solutions that reflect upon your child's strengths and remind your children that whatever it is they are going through, all problems have a beginning, a middle and an end. This problem, like Melbourne's weather, will not last forever!
