# WHAT IS A CINQUAIN POEM?


A cinquain is a five-line poem that does not rhyme, but follows a set pattern:

LINE 1: Subject Title


LINE 2: Two adjectives to describe the title.

LINE 3: Three action words (verbs) ending in -ing. LINE 4: A short sentence about the title (4 words).


LINE 5: One word related to the title.


