Next Friday **27 October** is **Day for Daniel**. Held annually on the last Friday of October, Day for Daniel honours the memory of Daniel Morcombe. As a community, we acknowledge this special day by wearing red and educating our children. **Next Friday**, **all St Paul's children are encouraged to wear red to honour Daniel and promote awareness of child safety**.

As parents and educators we have a responsibility to continue to educate our children around child safety. At school, your children will cover various topics and look at different ways that they can stay safe. The link below also provides information for parents to talk to their children. **Some of the content is sensitive,** so I encourage all parents to look carefully through this resource and see what is age appropriate for your child / children. Parent & carer guide

'That's Suss: eSafety Challenge' is suitable for children aged 8 to 12 years. It is designed to be played at home or at school.

That's Suss will teach children how to navigate suspicious situations online¹ in an engaging and age-appropriate way. Users are immersed in the narrative by choosing the character's next actions at key points throughout the story.

Each interactive pathway will direct users to existing reporting mechanisms, including **eSafety** and Australian Center to Counter Child Exploitation (ACCE). Users will also be educated about available support systems, such as **Kids Helpline** and **Safety Networks**².
