## Wellbeing

#### The best way to speak to our children about the current war...



As images of war unfold in the Middle East, parents are left wondering how to tell their children what is going on in Israel and Gaza. Professor Lea Waters from the University of Melbourne has shared some very insightful information about how we share sensitive and confronting information with our children. It's important to balance the need to protect our children from the news as well as equip them to be able to handle their emotions when they are dealing with it.

With young children, it's about keeping it very simple and dealing with simplified facts and their feelings. As parents we ask: 'Should we start a conversation or should we wait for our children to come to us?' The answer is simple - tune into your children. Children will often give us signals about how they are feeling. Explore this with your child. It's important to talk about emotions with your child. Go for a walk, write it down, share feelings. We need to equip our children to deal with life's realities. You might be wondering - do I shield my child from the media and news stories? Co-viewing is always an important part of helping your child to understand. It's important to have open dialogue with your child - tell me what you're hearing? It's important to inform our children but not overwhelm them. Context is the key. Show your child a map, inform them about how far away the war is. Explain - This has been happening for a long time, the war didn't just happen. It's important to have compassion for both sides and everyone involved. 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
