A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL, MARIA MECURI

Merri-Bek Children's Reference Group

Two of our year 5 children, Graysen and Emilia, had a wonderful opportunity to participate in an exciting Merri-Bek council initiative the Children's Reference Group, with the Key Aims of:

- Increasing children's voice and participation in Council decision making
- Promoting children's civic engagement
- Increasing children's leadership capability.

They had four sessions meeting in council chambers, hearing about Council strategies and contributing their ideas to these. Graysen and Emilia along with twelve other primary school aged children gave their suggestions towards; Child Safety, Transport, Open Spaces, improvements to the Coburg Library. All their ideas were presented on Wednesday and they were shown the draft copies of the strategies. It was wonderful to hear and see what was contributed by the youth of Merri-Bek. The strong theme was sustainability, protecting species, ensuring facilities can be enjoyed by all, including intergenerational play spaces. I was in awe in the ideas of our young people. The children met the Mayor of Merri-Bek, Cr Angelica Panopoulos, who was elected as Merri-bek's youngest ever Mayor. She showed them her mayoral chain, and they took photos wearing the chain. "Today we went to Merri Bek Council. Throughout the 3 meetings we had before today we had a say in a lot of things. During the first 3 meetings we talked about child safety, safe transportation, ways we talked about council at school and open areas in Merri-Bek. During the time that we had we helped make a 0 tolerence to child abuse poster, a childs rights poster, and contributed our ideas for a transport strategy that has now been put on the Merri-Bek website. But sadly today was our last meeting and during this meeting all the people that we helped by giving our ideas came back to show what we helped make which was really surprising that we made all of those things look the way they do today, But the best part was that we got to see the Mayor and were given certificates of participation and our lanyards then we all said goodbye and left."





At Merri Bek Council we reflected on what we have done through the past 3 meetings. First we discussed a poster, we helped choose and it was about child safety. We helped with how the layout was and the words put into it. We filled in a sheet about the special things about Coburg and I said everything. Then we had morning tea, there were little cakes and fruit. After morning tea we saw some of the people from the last 3 meetings and talked about what they took in about the discussion. It was about how they can improve parks and public spaces.






