

In groups we have made and shared presentations as a cohort.










We have been learning about colour poems.


We had to write poems where colours match our senses.

Students explore line and colour to represent different emotions!





The program is available for all children at St Paul's Primary School Coburg from 7:00am until 8:45 am in the morning and from 3:30pm until 6:00pm each school day.

During School Holidays & Pupil Free Days the service will operate from 7:00 am until 6:00pm.

Families are eligible for a Government Rebate called the Child Care Subsidy which can reduce the cost per session by up to 90%.
