- 3. Fill up the dishwasher before you use it it's like Tetris for your plates.









Dear Families,

Term 4 is speeding along and soon enough,

it will be time to wrap things up for another

end of a school year.



This term, I have spent time with children talking about the concept of change. We have explored the idea that change is a constant in our life. Some changes are small; some are big. Some changes are predictable and others are not.

As the children prepare themselves for upcoming changes next year, I thought it might be an idea for families to discuss the sentence starters provided below in order to explore both the children's understandings and feelings about upcoming changes.

I did explain to the children that a lot of thought, effort and collaboration goes into placing them into their 2024 class groups. Teachers make sure all children have at least one dependable friend in their class group next year who can help them both learn and feel safe and supported at school.

I want the children to also understand that although some things will change next year, many things stay the same. The children still learn about reading, writing and counting; they still have opportunities to learn about and celebrate their faith and they still interact in a familiar school space.

If children do feel a little nervous about next year, it is important for them to understand that this feeling makes sense. We all feel this way when we are unable to fully predict what will happen next! But like all things in life, this feeling will eventually change too!

If finding out about your child's day at school is most days a mission impossible. As parents we're dying to hear all the classroom gossip, but as far as they're concerned, the school day is over, and they don't want to think about it any more, thanks very much.

Asking the right questions – rather than the all-encompassing 'What have you done today?' can encourage them to part with snippets of information.

Try these alternatives to 'How was your day?' and see what your child has to say.

- What made you smile today?
- Can you tell me an example of kindness you saw/showed?
- What was the book about that your teacher read?
- Did anyone do anything silly to make you laugh?
- What did you do that was creative?
- What was the best thing that happened today?
- Did you help anyone today?
- What made you laugh?
- Did you learn something you didn't understand?
- Who inspired you today?
- What was the peak and the pit?
- What is something you heard that surprised you?
- What is something you saw that made you think?
- Who did you play with today?
- Tell me something you know today that you didn't know yesterday.
- What is something that challenged you?
- How did someone fill your bucket today?
 Whose bucket did you fill?

- Did you like your lunch?
- Rate your day on a scale from 1-10.
- How were you brave today?
- What questions did you ask at school today?
- Tell us your top two things from the day (before you can be excused from the dinner table!).
- What are you looking forward to tomorrow?
- What are you reading?
- What was the hardest rule to follow today?
- Teach me something I don't know.
- If you could change one thing about your day, what would it be?
- (For older kids): Do you feel prepared for your
 test?" or, "Is there anything on your mind that
 you'd like to talk about?"
- What made you feel happy?
- What made you feel proud?
- What made you feel loved?
- Did you learn any new words today?
- If you could switch seats with anyone in class,
 who would it be? And why?
- What is your least favorite part of the school building? And favorite?
- If you switched places with your teacher tomorrow, what would you teach the class?
