NAPLAN - Our Year 3 and Year 5 students commenced NAPLAN testing this week. This is an annual test for students in Australia, and it provides a snapshot of student proficiency in literacy and numeracy skills. It is important to remember it is one of the assessments we use to assess our children's learning. As we know there is so much more to our children that NAPLAN doesn't asses, all of the things that make each children unique and special – such as artistic and sporting talents, their resilience and problem solving abilities, or how caring and kind they are as a friend. We know our Year 3 and 5 children will do their best in this test.

Harmony Week- This week we celebrated Harmony Week. On Tuesday we gathered to acknowledge our diversity; with multi-age activities. The children have communicated the importance of our cultural diversity, encouraging values, promoting participation and establishing fun ways to learn.

This afternoon we came together as a whole school where students shared how they celebrated diversity and how we at St Paul's are an inclusive community. Each class made a pledge striving to include everyone by being respectful and treating each other with kindness. We continue to create a culture where everyone feels valued and appreciated.







YEAR 1/2

Who? What? Where? When? And why?



As members of 3/4SP, we pledge to be a great friend to everyone, no matter how different we are.


We'll celebrate what makes each of us special and treat each other with kindness and respect.

FROM THE OFFICE

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students


