
HOT LUNCH WEDNESDAYS!

LITERACY

ENGLISH ONLINE INTERVIEW

The English Online Interview (EOI) is a mandated online tool for assessing the English skills of students from Prep and Year 1. All students in Prep and Year 1 will engage in the EOI this term. It provides teachers with valuable data across the three modes of English: Reading and Viewing, Writing and Speaking and Listening. This data is used to generate reports that provide an overview of student achievement and allow the teachers an entry point when planning to cater to individual student needs.



FLUENCY

Fluency is an important precursor to reading comprehension. When students read fluently, they are better able to understand the text they are reading. Fluency requires practice through repeated readings of the same text.

The students in Year 3 - 6 have been focusing on developing reading with fluency and accuracy. Reading accurately and fluently involves:

- decoding
- reading smoothly
- attending to the punctuation
- using expression and
- pace (not too quickly and not too slowly).

One evidence-based fluency instruction strategy that the students have been engaging in is Echo Reading. In Echo Reading, the students listen to the text being modelled and read aloud by the teacher. The students read the the same text and receive quick positive and corrective feedback. This cycle can be repeated three times. Students can also practice this fluency instructional strategy with a partner, known as paired or partner reading.

This could be something you can try with your child at home, to continue to develop reading fluently and accurately.

Reading Fluency Checklist

Accuracy

I read the words accurately

Wy reading rate is just right — not too fast and not too slow!

Expression

I read with expression –NOT like a robot!

Punctuation

I read in phrases and show I understand the punctuation in the text.

NUMERACY





As you are aware our school currently partners with Essential Assessment to complement student learning in Numeracy.

The Essential Assessment parent platform allows our school to share your child's progress, as we work through each topic of their learning throughout the year. Mathematics Online Interview (MOI)

All students in Prep and Year 1 will engage in the MOI this term.

Why use the MOI?

Spending one-on-one time with students helps teachers to identify their ways of thinking, the methods they use, any misconceptions they may hold and their ability to explain their thinking. The MOI provides teachers with the opportunity to observe student thinking and behaviours and to listen to the strategies and language students use, in order to gain a sense of a student's mathematical understanding. This information informs teaching and learning and assists with the monitoring of student growth and progress over time.

INQUIRY

INQUIRY BASED LEARNING

Inquiry based learning allows students the opportunities to pose and respond to questions. It fosters curiosity and encourages them to become active participants in their own learning.

The Prep - 2 students will focus on developing an understandings of how their choices impact the wellbeing of themselves, others and the environment. The learning in Years 3 - 6 will involve exploring and investigating rules, laws and their implementation at various levels. These include rules at school, laws in the wider community and legislation at both a state and federal level.

Excursions have a sound impact on Inquiry learning. Students acquire knowledge and skills at school, however the experiences that a school offers are what students will remember, many years after their primary school education has been completed. The Year 5/6 students will engage in such an experience through their upcoming excursion to Parliament House on Monday 25 March. I took the time to ask some students from 5/6H about how they are preparing for this excursion and how it links with their Inquiry learning.

Moira - I have been learning about the three levels of government and I am excited about our excursion because I have never been to Parliament House.

Emma - My question iswhen was Parliament House built?



Tyra - I would like to find out how often Parliament meets?

Valentina - I am wondering when women were first allowed to vote?

FROM THE OFFICE

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students
