Our **year 3/4 children** had a wonderful experience on Monday. They participated in the **Life Saving Victoria Education Program**. Children learnt lots of important water


safety messages from Lifeguards at Sandridge beach Port Melbourne. As we have heard in the news lately there have been many tragic drownings in open water. This Life Saving Victoria gave our children some extremely valuable information, about rips, currents and how to do CPR, to help keep them safe near water. Here are some of their comments:



We learnt about Rip Currents, there are three types of rip currents. You can escape rip currents by moving to where the waves are. We learnt how to use Life jackets. The neck pillow helps you float. You can use the light to be seen.



How to surf and how to be safe while surfing: I mastered surfing! I kept falling off! I could go on my knees







We learnt to body surf.



We played Flags, Lifesavers used this method to save people

At 3:15 we will ask parents to move outside ready for dismisal.













FROM THE OFFICE

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students

Please contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form.



PERFORMING ARTS

Preps have been using their voices and bodies in different ways acting out characters and animals from two popular children's story books 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' and 'The Gruffalo.'




Senior artists have been creating Notan collage. They experimented with organic shapes and explored positive and negative space.
