We were out in the community, demonstrating what a vibrant school community St Paul's is. A huge thank you to all our staff who led these events.

Our Year 4 children are preparing to receive the **Sacrament of Eucharist.** On Tuesday, the children participated in the **Sacrament of Eucharist Family Evening** lead by Maria Forde. Families gained a deeper understanding of the meaning of this sacrament as the visible sign of God in this world. The children will receive the sacrament of Eucharist on Sunday, 4 August.

Prep Bedtime Story - On Wednesday evening our Prep children and their parents came to school in their pyjamas to hear a bedtime story read by their teacher at school. St Paul's hosted the Merri-Bek Early Years Network on Thursday afternoon. Forty Early Years educators from the Merri-Bek run centres, met in our staffroom to hear from our St Paul's staff about the work we are doing with children before they begin school. Our Prep teacher, Brunina spoke about transition to school and the connections we make with the kindergartens and childcare centres that our Prep children come from. Rita Ravida, who runs our Playgroup and is running our Jump Start To Prep program for the children beginning prep in 2025, spoke about school readiness. Nikki Ryan, St Paul's teacher who is training to be a Speech pathologist spoke about speech and language development. We also heard from Merri-Bek Occupational Therapist about the important fine and gross motor skills children need before they begin school. It was a great session hearing from the early childhood sector about the programs they are running and sharing the school experience. We made some great connections with the centres in the Merri-Bek area.













On Wednesday some of our **Year 6 Student Leaders visited Newlands Kindergarten** to run a STEM lesson using BeeBots.
This was a lovely opportunity for our year six students to develop leadership skills and engage with younger children in our local community. Our children worked with small groups of kinder children to program the BeeBots. It was an awesome experience.

Rowan the centre coordinator was very impressed with our children she sent us an email... "Just wanted to take the time to say thank you for your visit yesterday and just say I was blown away by the behavior and attitude of every single one of the students who attended. I was super impressed at their politeness but most importantly the way they approached the younger children in such a calm and caring manner. It can be hard to work with 3 and 4 year olds and every single person impressed me. The children in the group were talking about it for the rest of day and were so happy to tell their parents about it at the end of the day. We are so excited for organising some more visits"



PERFORMING ARTS









As part of Reconciliation week, in Performing Arts we celebrated Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture through song and dance.

Preps learnt 'Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes' in Ghana language and grooved to the Torres Strait island rhythms of 'Taba Naba.'

1/2s learnt Indigenous dance moves by cultural educator Sermsah Bin Saad which represent Australian animals - Kangaroo, Emu, Brolga, Crocodile and Goana. They showed their rhythmic skills by sequencing their movements to music.

3/4s learnt about songlines in Aboriginal culture, and storytelling through traditional dances that represent the Kangaroo, Emu and Echidna. They participated in a contemporary dance piece led by Aboriginal choreographer Chantal Kerr.

5/6s were introduced to 2019
Young Australian of the Year
Aboriginal Rap and Hip Hop artist
Baker Boy, and followed along to a
contemporary Yolgnu style Hip
Hop instructional tutorial led by
him.

Preps have delved into the fascinating world of artist Gary Hirsch and his incredible, BOTJOY creation! Our artists have designed their very own BOT using shape, a symbol was added to the body to represent its positive trait.

Year 5/6 artists are exploring the world of photography, capturing compositions which showcase not only their creativity but their understanding of the art elements of line, shape, colour, texture and value.







STEM


